What do Dads really want? (Father's Day reflections)

Just like there is no 'manual' on how to be a great father, there is no manual given out for family members explaining to them how to please your father or husband. However, there are lots of clues around, including many principles in the Bible.

I discovered one of these clues at a recent staff wellbeing conference I attended a few weeks ago. I found this clue somewhat interesting and somewhat humorous. I could not wait to share this information with my wife. Allow me to share it with you.

A huge study was conducted by Case Western University (in the USA) where researchers followed nearly 10 000 middle-aged men over a period of time. Obviously men at this age are prone to abnormalities such as high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol and angina (chest pain). Towards the end of the research, the scientists asked a series of questions and noted an interesting phenomenon. The men who answered 'Yes' to one particular question were significantly less likely to suffer from angina, even when they suffered from high levels of heart-related risk factors. Men who answered 'No' to this particular question suffered from almost twice as much angina. In fact, those who answered 'no' to this question had a three to five times higher risk of premature death and disease from ALL causes.

So what is this question I hear you ask? This particular question is *"Does your wife show you her love?"* (Please note 'show' not 'tell')

The conclusion established by the researches was that one of the most significant factors influencing the strength of men's health and well-being is **the quality of our close relationships** as opposed to the quantity (number) of relationships.

Now I need to be careful not to over-generalise as we are all unique and different, but from my experience men's love language is usually expressed in practical ways. For me, as a father and husband, I do appreciate words of love, but if the words are not followed up with practical action they lose their value. I highly appreciate love being expressed practically such as breakfast in bed on Father's Day, the small gift that was made with effort and thought, help with various tasks, having that sense of being heard and of course hugs and kisses.

In reflection, the same can be said about our spiritual relationship with our heavenly Father. I am absolutely positive that Father God loves our prayers of thanksgiving as well as our praise and worship, however what really pleases God is when we follow through with putting our love for God into action. This reminds me of the bible verses from James 2: 14 & 17: *"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them?"*

Dads, I hope you had a happy Father's Day and were shown lots of love!
