Summary of findings

In 2014, 81.2 per cent of young people who completed Year 12 at Calvary Christian College - Carbrook in 2013 continued in some recognised form of education and training in the year after they left school.

The most common study destination was Bachelor Degree (55.1 per cent). The combined VET study destinations accounted for 26.1 per cent of respondents, including 20.3 per cent in campus-based VET programs, with 11.6 per cent of Year 12 completers entering programs at Certificate IV level or higher.

5.8 per cent commenced employment-based training, all as apprentices.

In addition to the above study destinations, a further 2.9 per cent of respondents from this school deferred a tertiary offer in 2014 (deferrers are shown in Figure 1 in their current destination).

18.8 per cent did not enter post-school education or training, and were either employed (14.5 per cent), seeking work (2.9 per cent) or not in the labour force, education or training (1.4 per cent).

Figure 1: Main destination of Year 12 completers, Calvary Christian College - Carbrook 2014




Figure 3: Main destination of Year 12 completers, Calvary Christian College - Carbrook, Logan - Beaudesert and Queensland 2014




Figure 4: Main destination of Year 12 completers, Calvary Christian College - Carbrook 2010–2014


